HOW TO PRIME YOUR DRAIN TRAPS A COMMON HOMEOWNER MAINTENANCE ITEM

If you notice a sewer odour in your home, most likely it's just that your drain traps need to be primed. When drains are not used for a while the water in the trap will eventually evaporate which allows sewer gases to enter the home. If this occurs, you will have to prime the trap to stop the odour. It's actually a really easy fix.



All you need to do to stop the odour is to put water back into the trap. So, turn on the tap or get a bucket and fill it with about a gallon of water. Pour the gallon of water into your floor drains or any drain in the house that's not commonly used. The water in the drain will prevent the gases from coming up into the house.



It's less likely, but the water in the toilet trap also could have evaporated. Weeks of disuse could cause this. Of course, simple flushing will restore that water.

Any unused plumbing fixture can have a dry trap in as little as a month. If you haven't been to the cottage all winter you might want to do this as soon as you arrive or have

your maintenance man deal with it along the way. Don't forget to add water to the pipe that the washing machine goes into.

It was great to see you again last weekend. Thank you for dropping by with the paperwork that we had requested.

We want to share with you and your team at **BFS** some actual figures that will affirm your quest for and success in building energy efficient homes. There are many hidden details in the workmanship that **BFS** provides that might go unnoticed by many customers who have not ever built anything for themselves; however, those details - once noticed - become an "ah-ha" moment.

One of the features that resulted in the sale of our former lakeside home, which **BFS** built for us, was how economical it was to operate re hydro usage. Here are some of the figures that affirm energy efficiency in the two newer **BFS** homes that we now own:

- In 2010, **BFS** built a custom 962 square feet home with "affordable housing" in mind. When looking at the invoices from Veridian Hydro and Union Gas, the annual 2014 total of those two utilities, for one person living in that home, was \$1,102 or in simple terms \$92 per month. We have to remember that consumption is not restricted to heating the house, but includes everything else that uses hydro and gas! Amazingly economical!
- In 2013, we moved from the lake home into our new 1574 square foot **BFS-built** home in town. The costs of hydro and gas combined for the 2014 calendar year came in at \$1,942 again, that amounts to \$162 per month. The two of us live here 365 days of the year which means that we have NOT had any of the utilities shut down for holiday periods.

Thanks so much to you, Larry, and your team at **BFS** for the outstanding work done towards energy efficiency! We would be more than happy to act as references should anyone request one from an existing **BFS** home owner.
